There will be about 50 free papers. The free papers will be scrutinised by a committee of the International Council in addition to our National Council.

The International Association for the Prevention of Blindness and the International

Organisation against Trachoma will hold meetings during the Congress.

The two languages chosen by the International Council are English and French.

The Registration fees are:

- i. For Members from the Ophthalmological Societies affiliated to the International Federation: 150 Indian Rupees.
- ii. For Members from Non-Federated countries: 165 Indian Rupees.
- iii. For Associated Members (Wives and children accompanying the Members): 50 Indian Rupees.
- iv. For scientific Members: 50 Indian Rupees, without participation in Social functions.

You are requested to fill the attached post card signifying your intention to attend.
